About Eaton Farm

On March 22, 2005, Maine Yankee Atomic Power Company finalized its donation of 200-acre Eaton Farm to The Chewonki Foundation. The donation fulfills a commitment Maine Yankee made in its 1999 Federal Energy Regulatory Commission settlement agreement. In accepting the property Chewonki is obligated to create a nature preserve, maintain public access to the property, foster stewardship of the Sheepscot River estuarine environment, and provide a forum for dialogue on environmental policy issues. The 4.5 mile section of trail over Eaton Farm was the first in a long-range vision for a trail from Chewonki Neck to the Town of Wiscasset.

WHAT IS THE CHEWONKI FOUNDATION The story of Chevonki began in 1915, when our founder established a camp in an old farm field along the shores of Montsweag Bay, just west of The Eaton Farm. Over the years, Chevonki has become a preeminent force in conservation and natural history education, as well as a leader in helping young people grow as individuals and as active and responsible citizens.

PROGRAMS OF THE CHEWONKI FOUNDATION Camp Chewohi and Wildeness Expeditions serves boys and girls ages 8 to 18 throughout the summer months. Our Wildeness Expeditions have also grown to serve families and adults as well as temparys. including journeys in the North Woods of Maine to the wild rivers of the Arteric and Labrador.
