












Financial Aid

We are committed to making Chewonki programs accessible to participants from every walk of life, from across our nation, and from around the world. Thank you for making this possible!


Energy Generation

Over the past year, Chewonki has significantly reduced its C02 emissions and increased production of solar electricity megawatts here on campus.

In 2015, Chewonki produced 20 megawatt hours (Mwh) of solar electricity. In 2019, we produced 116.37 MWh! Our carbon output last year has been likewise been reduced by 295.89 tons because of solar generation, and we've replaced the equivalent of 68.6 barrels of oil with good ole sunshine.


Solar Energy Generated (MWh)



Revenue & Expenses


FY2019 Total Revenue: \$10,081,821




